These aims were all achieved with the help and co-operation of the club membership.

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

PRESIDENTS REPORT

I believe the year to have been quiet and successful, and I am particularly grateful to the officers of the Club and the Service Committee Chairmen. It has been a year for new blood with a new Secretary and Treasurer plus new chairmen of the Community and Vocational Service Committees. The real strength of the club remains as always with the membership in general.

On the statistical side, we have sadly lost two members through resignation, Howard Nuttall and Ron Flaherty - and gained only one, Leslie Stephenson. The one area in which we could possibly have done better, was in the recruitment of new members.

The issues that have risen spontaneously from within the club have not been as exciting as in some previous years, but nevertheless provided some cause for thought. In particular our decision to pull out of the cricket tent partnership – in which so many members have invested time and effort. We have become a registered charity under the guidance of Jake Davies who can hardly have expected such a chore during his first year as Treasurer. We have also had a look at the way Aperitif Meetings are working and expect to have introduced more meat into them by the end of this Rotary year.

My personal agenda for the year had only four items in it:

1. To strengthen our relationship with the Forest of Blean Club, which thanks to the efforts of Andrew Barchi and our sports cum social evening, has got under way.
2. To illuminate the activities of our main Service Committees far more and with the successful introduction of more frequent and detailed reports during open meetings, members have had the opportunity to appreciate the considerable efforts put in by other service committees.
3. Possibly the most challenging item was an attempt to re-introduce a Rotaract Club into Canterbury. This has been the only area in which some members have openly expressed reservation about the move. Colin Stone has done a wonderful job in getting the project under way and we now have a core of Rotaractors who will need our active support in the future. We must now maintain a matching core of Rotarians to give this support.
4. To introduce service awards to deserving people outside of Rotary, in recognition of their services to the community or elsewhere. Our first award to Hilda Keates has already been made and I hope that the process continues.
5. Other milestones for me include the Old Stagers production at the Gulbenkian Theatre, meeting a super set of foundation ambassadorial scholars, the excellent District Conference – for which we had such an enthusiastic delegation, the Vocational Committee debates and the enormous pleasure of entertaining some memorable visiting speakers to our meetings. (and of course all the other events that have slipped my mind at the time of writing.)

There are many members who work quietly for the club with out fuss or recognition, representing our interests in numerous ways. I would like to mention one – who will not thank me for the publicity, Chris Laming. Chris quietly and conscientiously looks after the jobs of Curator, Stewards Secretary and represents our interests to both the Cricket Club and the White Horse Caterers. He seems to have advanced the technique of gently prodding (those who need prodding) with a pointed stick almost to the level of a science. Thanks Chris, you have made my year a lot easier.

We tactfully engineered not winning the Invicta Inter-Club Golf Trophy.

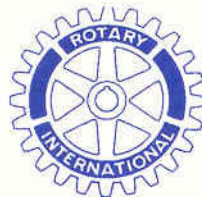

Community Service Report 1993/94

Acknowledgements

I am indebted to the members of the Community Service Committee who have been generous with their time and with their support for the Committee's activities over the past year. It has been a good year with many new initiatives in addition to regular events.

The Committee is also grateful to the local media, and the Kent Messenger Group and BBC Radio Kent in particular, for their willingness and help in publicising Rotary activities.

Fund Raising

We started the year off with a very successful fund-raising 'Swimathon' last August which raised £915.

In November we received two anonymous donations which helped us to buy a much needed computer for Gary Newman handicapped as a result of a serious head injury.

This month we managed to persuade the Rotary Club of Colchester, who were visiting Canterbury and lunched at the King's School, to donate a 'premium' of £145 on the cost of their lunch to our Hero Nightingale appeal. Seven year old Hero is very gifted child but is also very seriously handicapped and needs our help badly.

On 4th June 1994 the proceeds of Family Fun Day at the King's School Recreation Centre will go to the Samaritans and other local charities.

In July the Youth Orchestra of the Royal College of Music have agreed to donate the proceeds of their concert to local charities. This is a joint venture with Christ Church College and the King's School who have provided a venue and accommodation, respectively, to enable the Orchestra to come to Canterbury.

Service

During the past year, we have tried to give service as well as money to local charities and voluntary organisations. Committee Members have visited over a dozen voluntary organisations and individuals, establishing links with Rotary, assessing needs, and offering and providing practical help. The attached schedule A lists some of these.

In August 1993, we staffed the Strode Park 'Win-a-Car' stall, helping them to raise £448.

In December, six Rotarians took a group of handicapped children to the Kent and East Sussex Railway's 'Santa Special'. We are very grateful to Ian Wright for organising this. Next month, Ian is also arranging another outing for the children, this time to Benboms.

In March 1994, with the help of Alan Goodman, Ian MacDonald, Martin Ward and David Naumann, the Club presented its first Community Service Award to Hilda Keates for her services to 'Tapes for the Blind'.

In April, John Hill, and Alastair Scott joined Medway Club Rotarians as helpers at their biennial 'Handicamp'. This proved to a well-worthwhile and moving experience and one which we shall hope to repeat in future years.

In planning for the future, Roddy Tyndale-Biscoe has led a Committee initiative in developing stalls and activities which 'travelling' Rotarians can offer to charities and voluntary organisations to help them raise funds for themselves : we will provide the 'service' and 'equipment', they will benefit from the funds raised as a result of our help.

Donations

Over the past year, we have made donations, and provided facilities for voluntary organisations, to a total value of £1,260. Schedule **B** attached lists these.

Chairmanship

For the past year, I have been serving on the Executive Committee of the Independent Schools Bursars' Association and as Chairman of a number of its sub-committees. The ISBA serves some 600 schools and is undergoing rapid change and development. Since last month, I have also been asked to take on the duties of Honorary Treasurer. As a result, I am no longer able to devote enough time to the task of chairing the Community Service Committee. Roddy Tyndale-Biscoe has very kindly agreed to take over from me and I look forward to continuing to serve the Committee under his chairmanship.

"My" district conference was very enjoyable – perhaps because of my greater involvement. It was in the days of march past's which was seen by some as rather dated.

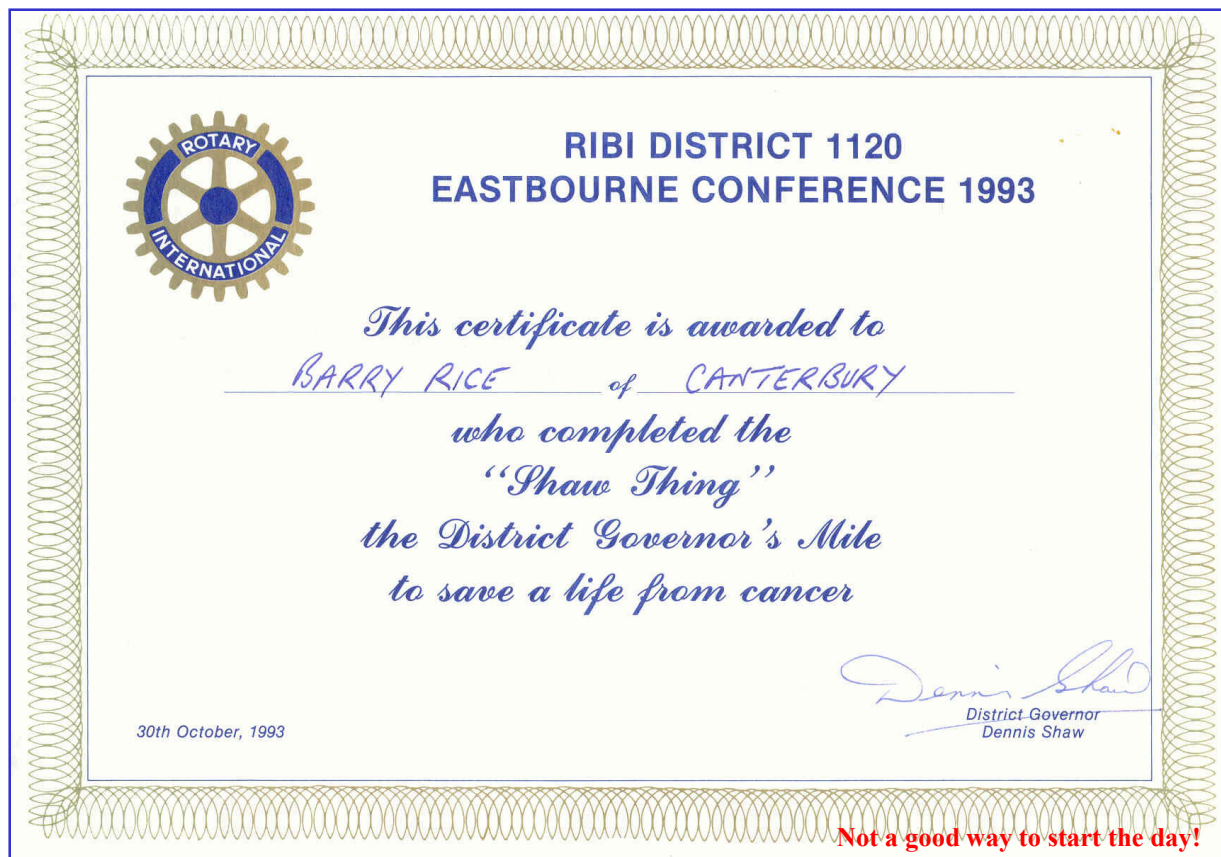
The photograph below shows Canterbury Rotarians assembled waiting to march past during the 'pageant.'

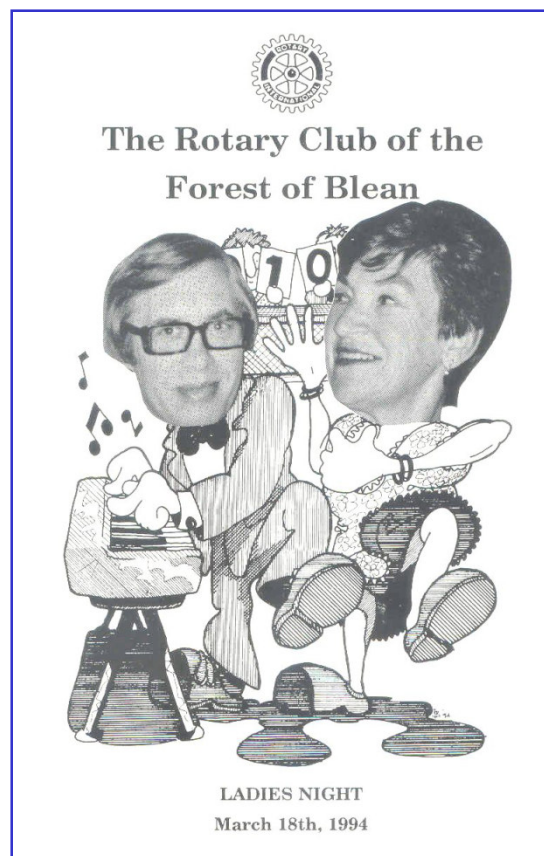
There were a many good speakers on parade. My personal favourites were:


Dear Barry

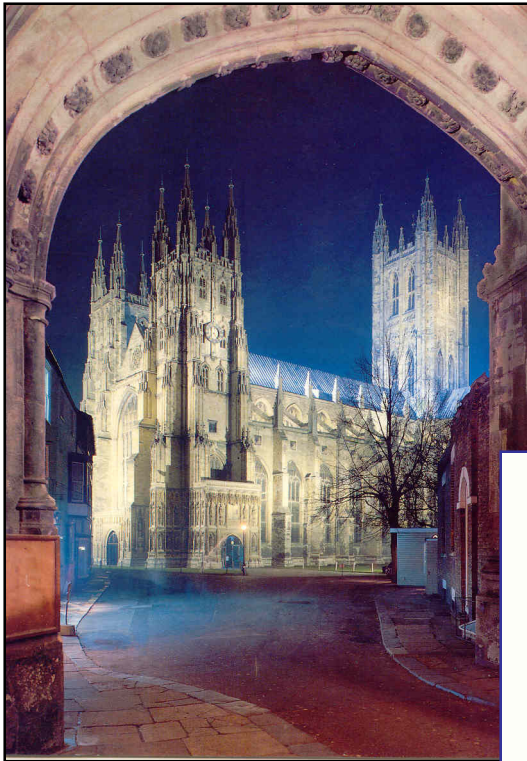
