

# Rules

## 1. Your Ideas Matter

We're looking for ideas that can improve life in some way! The winning idea
will be chosen by our judges based on how innovative it is and its potential to make a big impact.

## 2. Think Big\_

Your idea can focus on any aspect of the human or natural world—local, national, or global. It can be technical, organisational, artistic, or something else entirely. We've included some theme suggestions in the appendix, but feel free to tackle any issue you're passionate about!

# 3. Special Prize Alert

The Chowdhury Family is offering a special award for a simple, creative, and practical idea that supports global health.\_

### 4. Make It Feasible

Your idea should be practical and achievable, but it doesn't have to be completely new or fully developed.

# 5. Teamwork or Solo

You can submit entries individually or as part of a team of up to four people.\_

## 6. Enter as Many Times as You Like

Got lots of ideas? Go ahead and submit them all!\_

#### 7. Who Can Enter?

This competition is open to students attending secondary schools, sixth-form colleges, or equivalent institutions in areas supported by the STEM Hub at Canterbury Christ Church University (Kent, Medway, Sussex, Surrey, Hampshire, Isle of Wight, Oxfordshire, West Berkshire, Reading, Milton Keynes and Buckinghamshire). If you're not sure if your school is eligible, feel free to ask the organisers!

# 8. Entry Requirements

Your entry should:

- Fit on one A4 page (plus sketches or photos if needed).
- Include the name of your idea, your name, and your school.

- Explain the problem you're solving and why your idea is better than other solutions.
- Share any research you've done, including market potential and cost details.
- Be submitted as a PDF.
- Be accompanied by a cover email listing all team members, their schools, ages, and a contact email. Note: Missing details may result in rejection.

# 9. Judging Panel

A group of local judges, selected by the Rotary Club of Canterbury, will review all entries.

# 10. Final Judging in June 2025\_

Shortlisted finalists will be invited to present their ideas to an audience (subject to Government guidelines). If you live within 40 miles of Canterbury, we'll expect you to attend in person. If you're further away, you can join via Teams. Presentations should be no longer than six minutes.

All finalists will receive a certificate and a book token.
